

TRADE UNION BRIEFING

Scotland United Against Austerity

Purpose: The STUC has called this event to demonstrate the widespread opposition to the Tory Government in Scotland and to unite across the UK in opposition to further austerity and attacks on trade unions. Organised jointly with the People's Assembly in Scotland and sponsored by the key groups involved in that coalition. Coinciding with major events taking place in London and the rUK. The STUC expects thousands to attend.

Details: Rally in George Square from 12noon—4pm with keynote speakers from the trade union movement, anti-austerity, campaigning and community organisations. The rally will include a trade union organising point at which attendees can join, receive further information about trade unions and trade union campaigns.

Key trade union message: Trade unions aim to be in the forefront of the campaign in Scotland against austerity. Trade union membership and activity has a key role in reversing existing policies and building solidarity and social justice and proposed attacks on trade union freedom must be resisted.

Key features: Family friendly event designed to unite all those who oppose Tory rule and continuing austerity irrespective of their voting decision in the referendum or the recent General Election. Speeches interspersed with music and entertainment with people free to attend at different points in the day.
